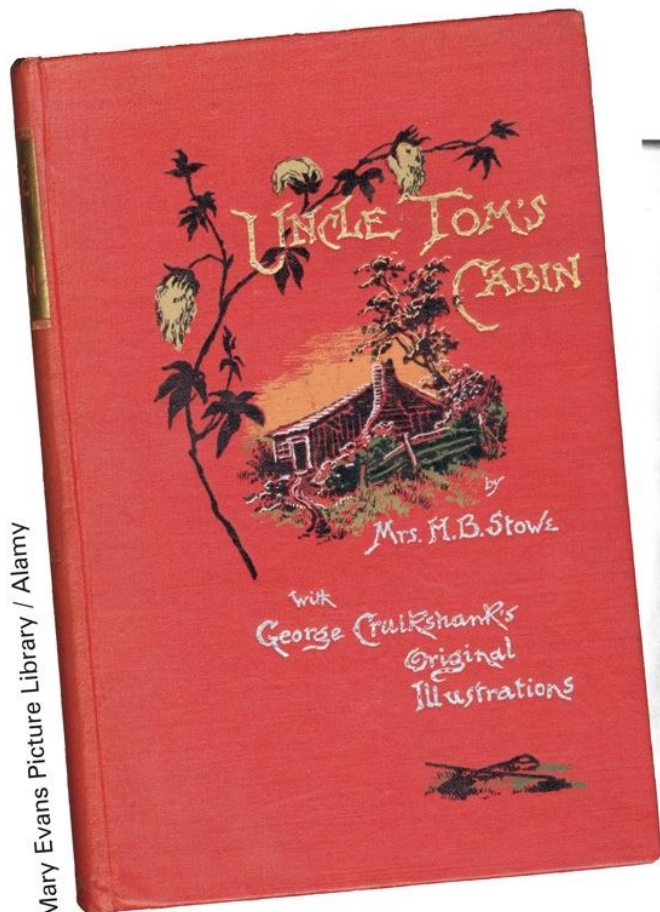

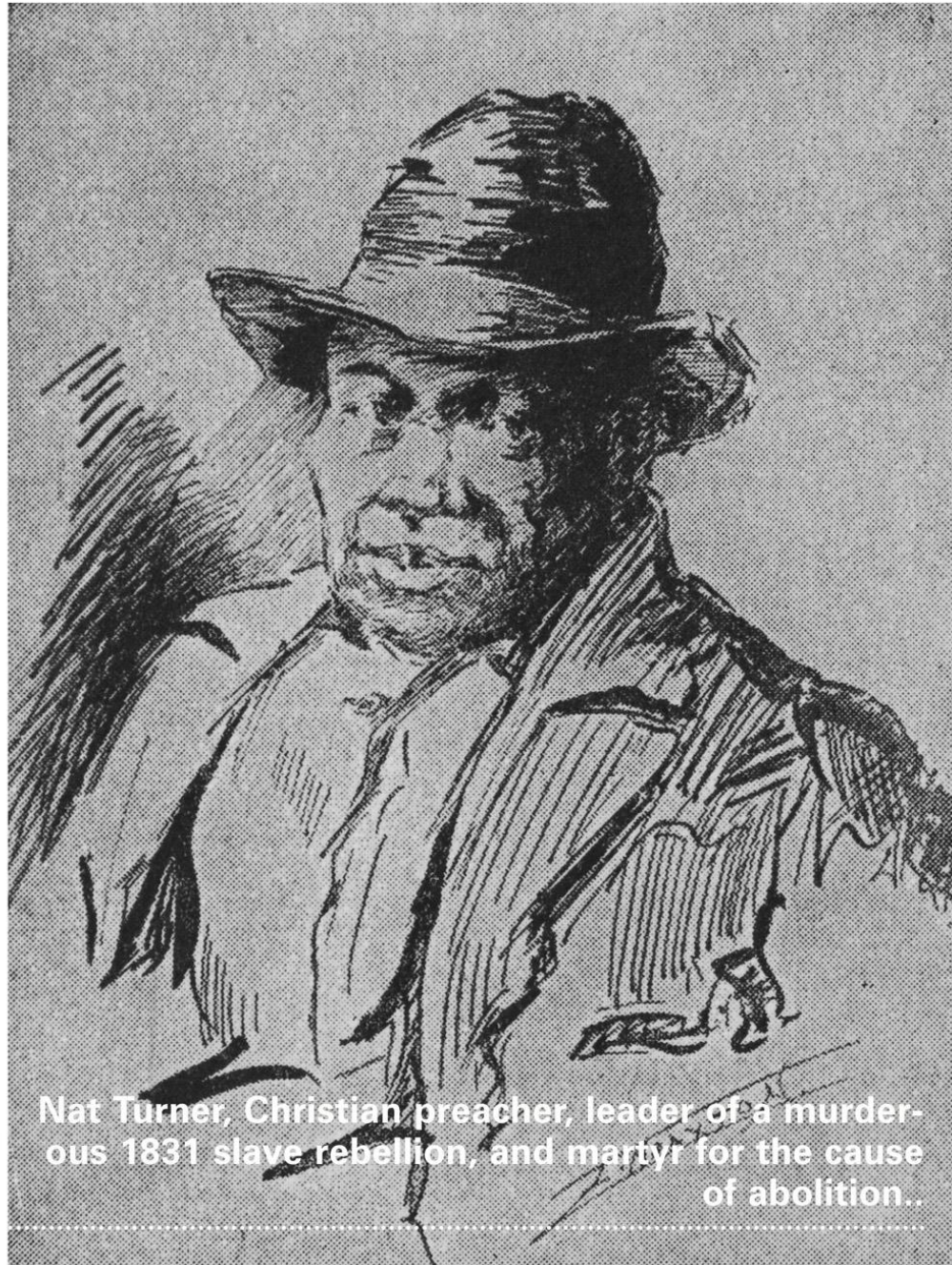

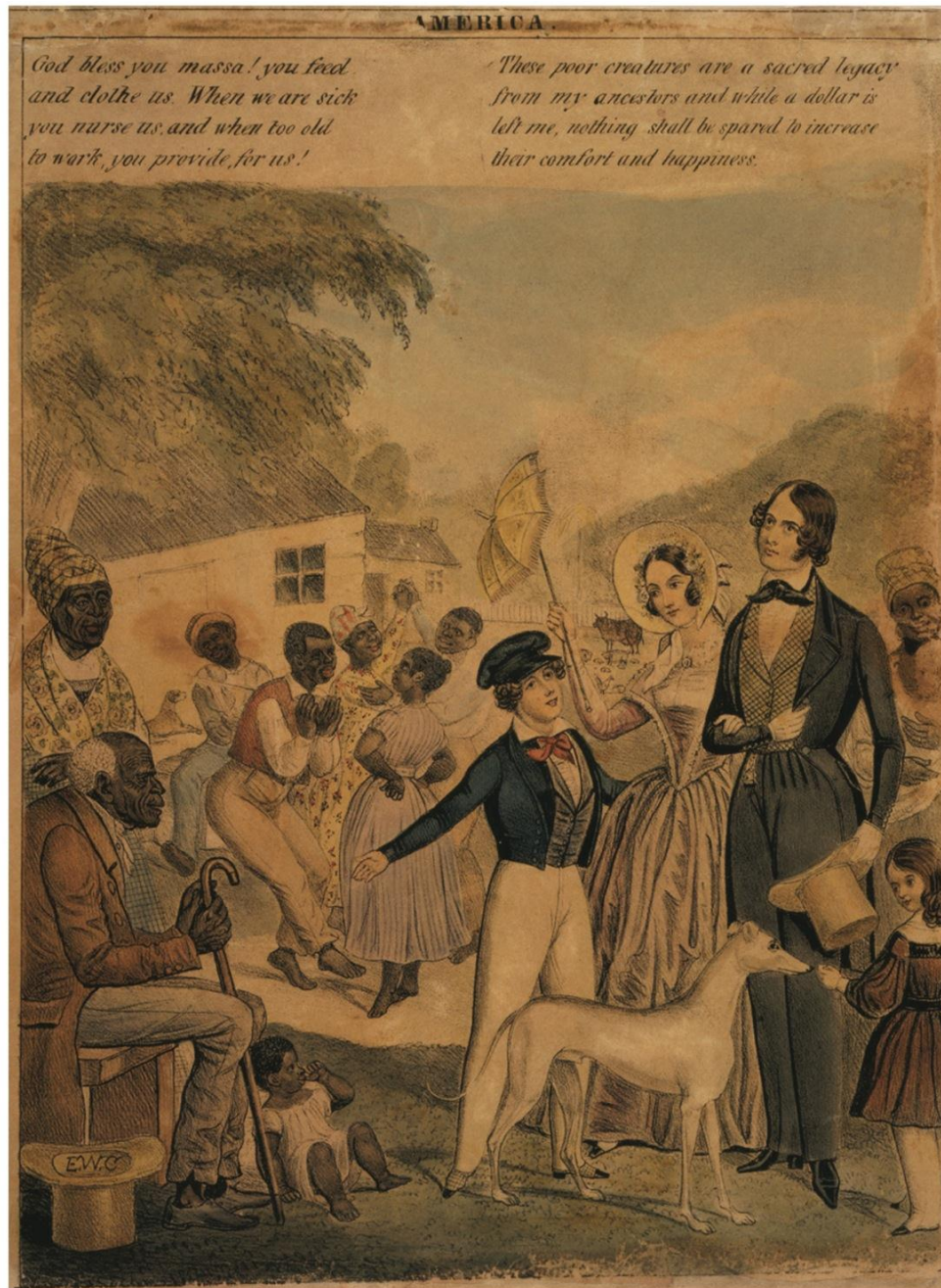

| 1848 | Revolutions occur throughout Europe protesting industrial disorder and aristocratic rule. Most fail. |
| 1848 | Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels publish <i>The Communist Manifesto</i> . |
| 1849 | The first safety pin is patented. |
| 1850 | Beer is first sold in glass bottles. Before that, patrons had their beer poured into a bucket or cup that they brought with them. |
| 1857 | The words and music to “Jingle Bells” are registered, under the title “One Horse Open Sleigh”—which didn’t stick. |
| 1857 | Elisha Graves Otis demonstrates his passenger safety elevator at the Crystal Palace Exposition in New York by cutting the elevator’s cables as it ascends a 300-foot tower. |
