

 There was no single cause of the Great Depression




# **Statistics**

- Between 1929 and 1933, about 9,000 banks closed
- The national unemployment rate skyrocketed from 3.2 percent in 1929 to nearly 25 percent in 1933







 Franklin Roosevelt received 22.8 million votes to Herbert Hoover's 15.7 million

Hoover (Republican)	59	11%	15,761,841	39.6%



What else was happening		
1930	Vannevar Bush at MIT invents the "differential analyzer," or analog computer.	
1931	Japan, seeking raw materials for its own industrial growth, invades Manchuria, bringing Japan and China into conflict that would erupt into war in 1937.	
1933	Ruth Wakefield bakes the first chocolate chip cookie.	
1934	The first laundromat, the "washeteria," opens in Texas.	
1934	Amid Germany's own economic depression, Hitler becomes dictator.	
1937	Hormel introduces its canned pink mystery meat, Spam.
