





1996	As an April Fool's joke, Taco Bell runs a full-page ad in newspapers, including the <i>New York Times</i> , claiming that the fast-food chain has just bought the Liberty Bell for \$1 million. The joke goes on to say that there are plans to rename it the "Taco Liberty Bell." For a full day, it is taken as a legitimate news event.
1997	Nevada becomes the first state to pass legislation categorizing Y2K data disasters as "acts of God," protecting the state from lawsuits that might be brought against it by residents in the year 2000.
1997	Scientists at Roslin Institute in Scotland clone a sheep, Dolly.
1997	Princess Di is killed in a car crash in Paris.
